
STATE OF THE WORLD

- 1. U.S. economy is running at \$10 trillion. The National Debt is topping \$8 trillion.

- 3. 50 of the world's largest banks, 35 in U.S. and Europe, 15 in Japan are in trouble. Some have already failed. We are heading for a profound financial crisis.

- 1. Nuclear war, (agreed by experts) will happen something unthinkable.
- 2. Nuclear warheads Russia has 6000, U.S. has 2500, China has 400, Israel has 200.
- 3. Nuclear blast 45 million people would be killed with one blast. Zechariah's 13:8 has 2/3 killed not far fetched.
- 4. Peace In 5500 years of recorded history, civilization had only 300 years of peace.
- 5. Terrorists Terrorists are found throughout the world. Prime motive is religious and not political.

IS THE CATHOLIC CHURCH DECLINING IN THE USA?

The fastest growing religious group in America today are those who claim no religious affiliation. What about the Catholic Church? Here are some statistics:

- Weekly attendance at mass dropped from 74 percent of enrolled Catholics in 1958 to just 25 percent in 2000.
- In 1965, there were 58,000 priests in the U.S. By 2002, there were 45,000, of whom 16 percent were from other countries.
- In 1965, 1,575 priests were ordained, compared to only 450 in 2002.
- Seminarians in the U.S. numbered 49,000 in 1965, compared to just 4,700 in 2002.
- Nuns in the U.S. dropped from 180,000 in 1965 to 75,000 in 2002 and their average age was 68.
- The number of Catholic high schools has dwindled from 1,556 in 1965 to 786 in 2002; the number of grade schools went from 10,503 to 6,623.
- In 1968, only 338 marriages were annulled. In 2002 there were 50,000 annulments.
